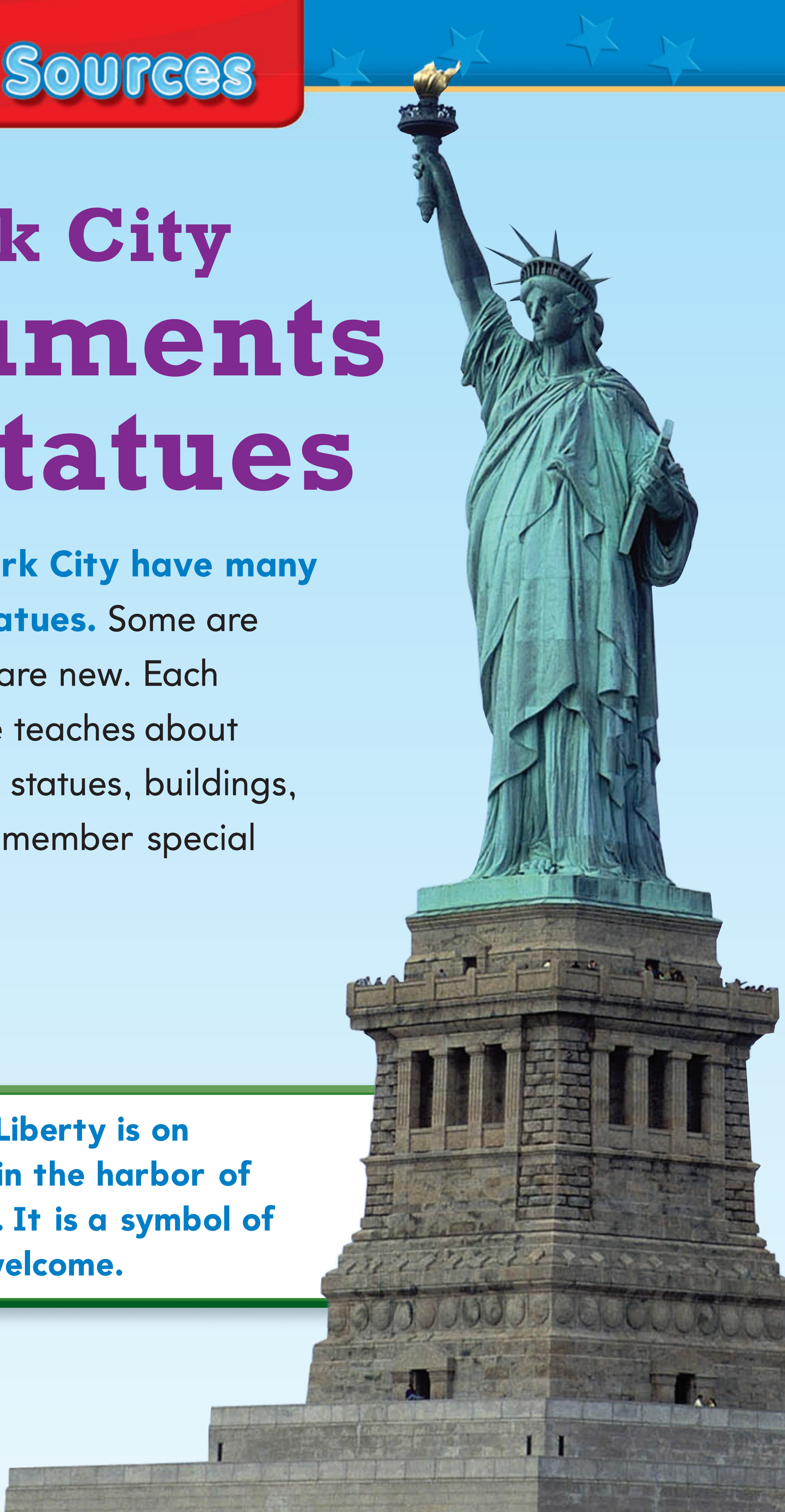




New York City Monuments and Statues
